The NCFE Level 3 Diploma in Playwork is designed for individuals who work or aspire to work in play settings, supporting children and young people to engage in freely chosen, self-directed play. This qualification provides the knowledge, skills, and understanding required to create safe, stimulating, and inclusive play environments that promote creativity, independence, and well-being.

Who is this course for?

- Current playworkers seeking a formal qualification.
- Those working in out-of-school clubs, adventure playgrounds, holiday schemes, or similar settings.
- Individuals aiming to progress into supervisory or managerial roles within playwork.

Course Aims

- Develop a deep understanding of the playwork principles and their application.
- Equip learners with the ability to plan, deliver, and evaluate play opportunities.
- Promote inclusive practice and safeguard children and young people in play settings.
- Support professional development and progression within the playwork sector.
